

The Island Garden's Best Waterlilies

Plant Name: Almost Black Hardy Waterlily

Botanical Name: Nymphaea 'Almost Black'

Hybridizer: Slocum

Year: 1994

Attributes: Green pads over 7 inches across, fairly free flowering, Marliac rhizome

Bloom: Red outer petals deepening towards the center, yellow stamen, 4-5 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom

pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. The hybridizer states that this plant is an inter-subgeneric cross between a hardy waterlily and a tropical waterlily.



Plant Name: Attraction Hardy Waterlily

Botanical Name: Nymphaea 'Attraction'

Hybridizer: Marliac

Year: 1910

Attributes: Green pads up to 10 inches across, Fairly free flowering, Marliac rhizome

Bloom: Pink petals, deepening towards the center with prominent white and pink striped sepals, yellow stamen, 5-6 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom



pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. One of the largest red/pinks.

Plant Name: Charlene Strawn Hardy Waterlily (no photo)

Botanical Name: Nymphaea 'Charlene Strawn'

Hybridizer: Strawn

Year: 1969

Attributes: Green pads about 8 inches across, very free flowering, Marliac rhizome

Bloom: yellow petals, greenish yellow sepals, yellow stamen, about 6 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. One of the more fragrant hardy waterlilies.

Plant Name: Chrysantha Hardy Waterlily

Botanical Name: Nymphaea 'Chrysantha'



Attributes: Green pads about 4-5 inches across, new pads have light mottling, free flowering, upright rhizome

Bloom: Petals are creamy yellow changing to a creamy orange by the third day, yellow stamen, about 2 to 3 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be



sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. One of the aquatic gardener's favorites. Easy to grow and the flower color changes!

Attributes: Green pads about 5 inches across, free flowering, Marliac rhizome

Bloom: Petals are white with a hint of pink towards the center, yellow stamen, about 3 to 4 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis.



at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis.





Plant Name: Deep Purple Hardy Waterlily (no photo)

Attributes: Pads are green with heavy bronze mottling 6 to7 inches across, fairly free flowering

Bloom: Petals are a deep red with a hint of purple, burnt orange stamen, about 5 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. This is an inter-subgeneric cross between a tropical and a hardy waterlily.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with

at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis.



Plant Name: Georgia Peach Hardy Waterlily (no photo)

Botanical Name: Nymphaea 'Georgia Peach'

Hybridizer: Strawn

Year: 1998

Attributes: Pads are green about 5-7 inches across, very free flowering, odorata rhizome

Bloom: Petals are peach colored, yellow stamen, 4 to 5 inches round, late spring to fall The blossoms are held higher above the water than some.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis.

Bloom: Petals are white, yellow stamen, 5 to 6 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with

at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis.



Bloom: Petals are pink in the center fading to white on the outside, yellow stamen, 2 to 3 inches round, late spring to fall.



Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. Another of the aquatic gardener's favorites. Very nice small specimen.

Bloom: Petals are bright yellow, yellow stamen, about 4 inches round, late spring to fall.

Culture: Full sun is a requirement. Best grown in pot with

at least 5 gallons of soil, but can be grown in a mud bottom pond as well. At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. While this plant is highly regarded by professionals, the aquatic gardener doesn't feel it does well in the Kansas City climate. It would probably do much better in the South.



Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. One of the aquatic gardener's favorite waterlilies. It is one of the first to bloom in the spring, blooms through the summer and is one of the latest blooming in the fall. It is extremely free flowering.



At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. Very slow to establish.

At least 6 inches of water over the crown is required, preferably 12-24 inches of water over the crown. Plant only after water temperature is above 60°F. Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. The flowers are held higher above the water than most other waterlilies.

Fertilize every two weeks for best flower display. Calm water is preferred. Be sure that the crown is at least 12 inches below the surface of the water before winter.

Comments: It is a good idea to remove spent flowers and yellow pads on a regular basis. This is a very unusual plant as the color fades from the outside of the flower in instead of fading from the inside of the flower out as in most other waterlilies. The mottled pads are also quite attractive.
